PREVENTION OF AND FIRST AID FOR
SKIN IRRITATION FROM CREOSOTE

1. GENERAL

1.001 This addendum supplements Section 010-100-010.

1.002 It is issued to cover the changes in the types of materials used for prevention of and treatment of Creosote burns.

3. PREVENTIVE MEASURES

The following changes apply to part 3 of the Section.

3.01(d) - revised.

3.01(f) - revised.

3.01(d) When direct contact of the skin with creosote is likely, rub the arms and face well with vaseline (local purchase) or with medicated ointment before starting the work. As soon as practicable after completing the work, remove the protective coating with a clean, dry cloth. Then wash thoroughly with soap and hot water.

3.01(f) When there has been direct contact of the skin with free creosote, wash the skin with plenty of hot water and soap. Then coat the affected area with medicated ointment.

4. FIRST AID PRACTICES

The following changes apply to part 4 of the Section.

4.01(a) - revised.

4.01(a) Skin Irritations.

(1) Wash the affected area with plenty of hot water and soap. Dry the area and apply medicated ointment.

(2) If the irritation continues for 24 hours or if a large area is affected, obtain a doctor's services.
