MACHINE, STATION NUMBERING – DESCRIPTION

1. GENERAL

- 1.01 This section covers a noncoded Bell System station numbering machine.
- 1.02 When this section is reissued, the reason for reissue will be listed in this paragraph.

A small, sturdy station numbering machine, used to stamp telephone numbers on station number cards and designation strips, is available.

The machine is equipped with seven wheels. It also includes a small ink pad integral with the machine which automatically re-inks the set of numbers prior to each stamping operation. In addition to the numerals from 0 through 9, the machine has settings to imprint the words EXT, COM, and SIG, when appropriate.

Each printing number (or character) is about 5/32-inch in height and is in Gothic style. The dial settings position the wheels so that each series of printing numbers will lie on a straight horizontal line. The base plate is marked by permanent scorings to facilitate positioning the machine on a station number card, designation card, etc.
