## INTRODUCTION

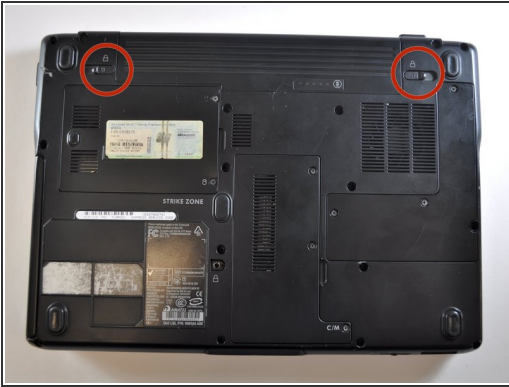

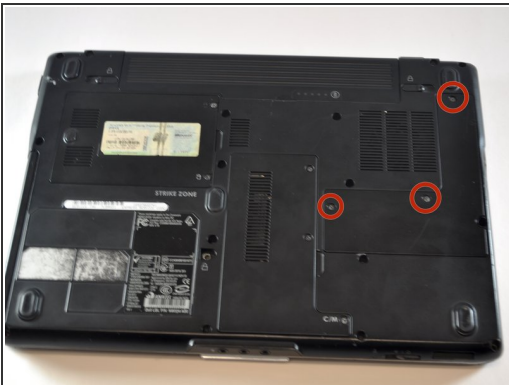

## Step 1 — Battery



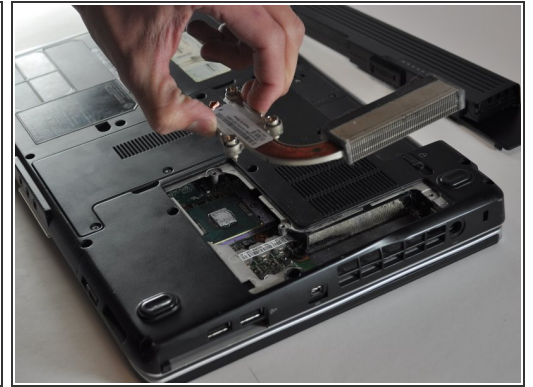
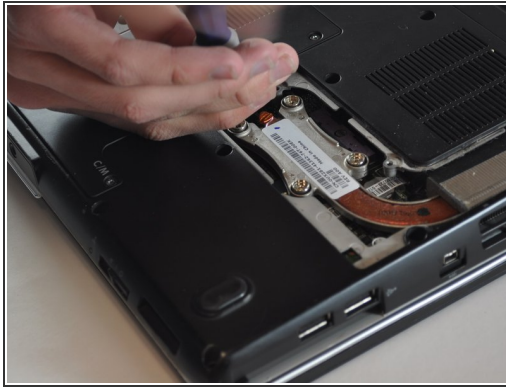
- Slide the two tabs to release the battery.
- Pull the battery out.

## Step 2 — Remove the Panel



- Using a Phillips #00 screwdriver, remove the three 5mm screws.
- Lift the panel and set it aside.

## Step 3



- Remove the four screws (3mm) securing the heat sink to the CPU.
- Lift the Heat sink out of the laptop.

To reassemble your device, follow these instructions in reverse order.
