

INTRODUCTION


In this guide, you will learn how to grab and embed an HTML code that allows you to publish an iFixit guide or teardown onto another site.

Step 1 — View teardown or guide




- Navigate to the teardown or guide page that you would like to embed.

Step 2 — Select language (optional)




- If you wish to embed the guide or teardown in a different language than the one currently selected:
 - Click on the flag icon in the upper right of the header bar.
 - In the pop-up window, click to select the desired language.

Step 3 — Create embed code




- Click the "Options" button on the upper-righthand corner of the page.
- Select "Embed This Guide" from the dropdown menu.

Step 4 — Copy embed code



- A pop-up window will appear with an HTML embed code and a preview of your embedded guide.
- Select the size you wish the embedded guide to be.
- Copy the auto-generated HTML code.


Step 5 — Embed guide on your site

<span style="font-weight: 400;">Here's how it works:</span>  
  
<span style="font-weight: 400;">Navigate to the "Options" button at the top-right corner of whatever guide or teardown interests you. Select "Embed this Guide" to bring up a window with the HTML code for the guide and a preview of what the guide will look like its embedded form. Copy and paste the HTML code into your website and the guide will display as a small widget.</span>


