



How to Fix a Broken Zipper

Fix a broken zipper with these quick and simple steps.

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INTRODUCTION

This guide will thoroughly explain how to easily repair a zipper that is broken. No special requirements needed; just needle-nose pliers, scissors, and a needle and thread!

TOOLS:



- Large Needle Nose Pliers (1)
- Fabric Scissors (1)
- Needle (1)
- Thread (1)

Step 1 — How to Fix a Broken Zipper



- Take the needle nose pliers and remove the metal or plastic stopper at the end of the zipper.
- Zip the zipper all the way down to the last set of teeth.

Step 2



- Align both sides of the zipper evenly and slip the zipper back on track.

Step 3



- Start zipping up the zipper to make sure it has been aligned properly.

Step 4



- Thread the needle.
- Sew up the area where the metal or plastic stopper used to reside.

Step 5




- Tie off what has been sewn by making a knot in the thread.

Step 6



- Take the scissors and cut off the access thread. Get as close to the knot as you can without cutting it off.

Step 7



- Zip up the garment to make sure everything is working properly.

To reassemble your device, follow these instructions in reverse order.
