Shows the disassembled kinderglo nightlight, hopefully a help to any DIY repairs.

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INTRODUCTION

Kinderglo night lights are loved by kids but don't stand up to drops and bumps. They are now discontinued so if you want them to keep working you will have to DIY the repair.




Step 1 — Getting the module out



- This product has a light module glued into a rubberized semi opaque toy. The module is set into an inset cup. Remove it by prying towards the center and under the lip of the module. I had to use an x-acto knife to cut it out.

Step 2 — The module



- The bottom comes off then the sides snap apart revealing two PCBs connected with 5 wires and a battery soldered on to each board. There are two springs in the base that connect the charging plate and the button. The button will probably fall out. Also the enclosure can come apart while still in the toy when dropped; I glued it when I reassembled it.

To reassemble your device, follow these instructions in reverse order.

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
