INTRODUCTION

This video will show how to use the MapKeyboard software to map a broken key to another lesser used key. This will be useful if you have a keyboard with a broken key that cannot be replaced or repaired, but still want to continue to use that keyboard. Step 1 — One key replacement



- 1. When one of your keyboard's keys is broken, you don't want to spend a lot of money to replace the entire keyboard because of one key
- 2. You can use a software called "MapKeyboard"
- 3. Start the software and select the key you will use to replace the broken key
- 4. Select "ReMap selected key to" and select the broken key "G"
- 5. Click on "Save layout" and the laptop will restart
- 6. After restarting, you will find that the key you set can be typed with "G" so that you can continue to use your keyboard without changing it
- 7. If you want to restore the layout of the keyboard, you can start the software again, click on "Reset keyboard layout"
- 8. After the restart, it will be restored

To reassemble your device, follow these instructions in reverse order.
