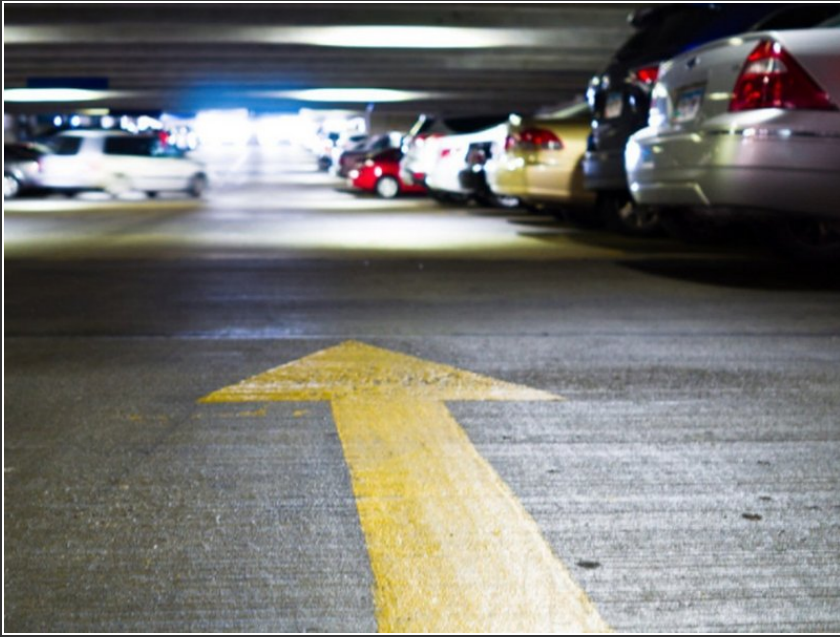


## Step 1 — Downtown Center Cinemas
